- Mother working three part-time jobs
- Babysitting his little brother
- Late nights with schoolwork
- Mother not there to help

Jordan's Current Circumstance

- Covid 19 causes his mother to lose two jobs
- Homelessness
- Food Insecurity
- Anxiety for his mother and baby brother
- Challenges w/ Special Needs, Dyslexia, and/or ELD
- Dropping out of school VS employment



Academic Solutions for Jordan

G4G Student Support Program

Student Support Program 1

- Instructors assigned to each student for in-person schoolwork support
- Short-term & Long-term goals established
- Grades reviewed throughout the support
- IEP's & learning styles designed into the academic support
- Progress Reports produced every two weeks

Student Support Program 2

- Instructors assigned to deliver small group collaborative lessons based on school site standards
- Three learning labs spaced apart at a local park
- Learning Lab 1 - math, science, & engineering
- Learning Lab 2 - creative writing, visual arts, & music/ performing arts
- Learning Lab 3 – team building activities and recreational skills
- Progress Reports produced every two weeks

The Student Support Process

Step 4

- Jordan begins his selected SSP

Step 3

- Jordan is matched w/ an assigned instructor
- Meals, transportation, & childcare is made available

Step 2

- Does Jordan need schoolwork support: SSP 1
- Should Jordan need participate in park site learning labs: SSP 2

Step 1

- Social Service Partners Identify Jordan
- Assess Jordan's Learning Styles

Step 5

- Jordan's learning styles used for more effective understanding
- Produce progress reports every two weeks

Step 6

- The progress reports are shared with his family, schoolteachers, and supporting personnel

Step 7

- Communication is kept open and consistent
- An assessment of the program is offered to every family & student

Jordan's Efforts with Grades 4 Good

- A heightened sense resilience & value
- Ability to improve for his family
- A much-needed sense of optimism for the future

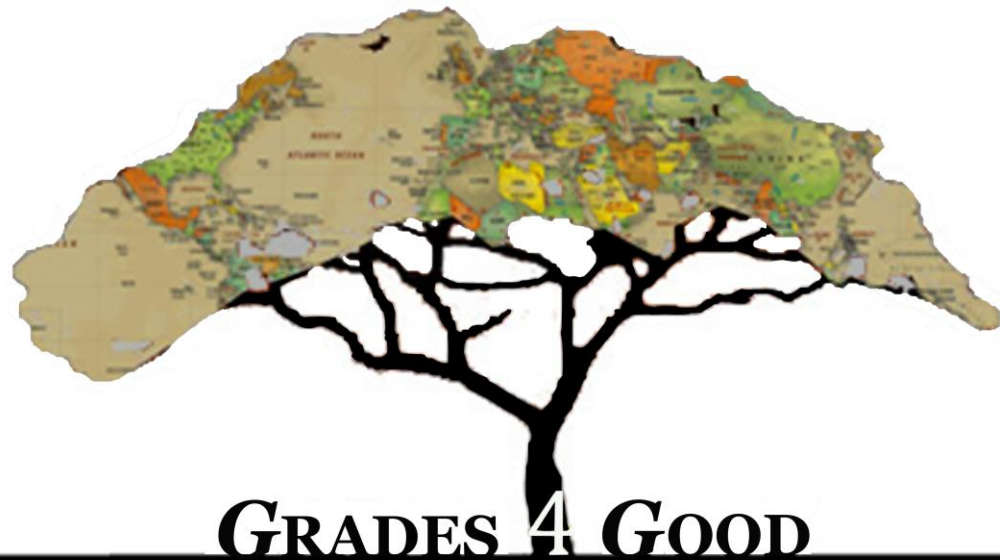


- More time together as a family
